This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹²and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. ¹³Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.



...Keep us faithful, and fruitful, and hopeful, and peaceful, until we come at last to the one table of your Kin-dom, to feast with all your saints in the joy of your eternal realm, with you and with your Word, through Christ and in Christ, the one who came for us, died for us, and rose for us, the one who prays even for us, the one who first taught us to pray, saying:

Our God, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kin-dom come, thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kin-dom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

Our Ushers will invite you to come forward row by row and line up to receive. With an open palm you will receive the bread dipped in the cup of grape juice.

If you wish to receive a blessing, rather than communion, simply cross your arms across your chest.

If you need or prefer to receive communion where you are seated, raise a hand to the usher and we will bring the elements to you.

If you would like gluten-free bread, please ask your communion server. After you receive, you are invited to the altar rail for prayer and meditation. All is ready. Come.


