

Scripture: Psalm 139: 1-12, 23-24 The Inclusive Bible

YHWH, you've searched me, and you know me. You know if I am standing or sitting, you read my thoughts from far away. Whether I walk or lie down, you are watching; you are intimate with all of my ways. A word is not even on my tongue, YHWH, before you know what it is: you hem me in, before and behind, shielding me with your hand. such knowledge is too wonderful for me, a height my mind cannot reach!

Where could I run from your Spirit? Where could I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you're there; If I make my bed in Death, you're already there. I could fly away with wings made of dawn, or make my home on the far side of the sea, but even there your hand will guide me, your mighty hand holding me fast. If I say, "The darkness will hide me, And night will be my only light, even darkness won't be dark to you; the night will shine like the day darkness and light are the same to you.

Examine me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts see if there is misdeed within me, and guide me in the way eternal.

Scripture: Romans 8: 12-25 The Inclusive Bible

Therefore, we are under an obligation, my sisters and brothers—but not to the flesh or to live according to the flesh. If you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if you live by the Spirit, you will put to death the evil deeds of the body and you will live.

Those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. For the Spirit that God has given you does not enslave you and trap you in fear; instead, though the Spirit of God has adopted you as children, and by that Spirit we cry out," Abba!" God's Spirit joins with our spirit to declare that we are all God's children. And if we are children, we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing in Christ's suffering and sharing in Christ's glory.

Indeed, I consider the sufferings of the present to be nothing compared with the glory that will be revealed in us. All creation eagerly awaits the

revelation of the children of God. Creation was subjected to transience and futility, not of its own accord, but because of the One who subjected it—in the hope that creation itself would be freed from its slavery to corruption and would come to share in the glorious freedom of the children of God. We know that from the beginning until now, all of creation has been groaning in one great act of giving birth. And not only the creation, but all of us who possess the firstfruits of the Spirit—we too groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free.

In hope we were saved. But hope is not hope if its object is seen; why does on hope for what one sees? And hoping for what we cannot see means awaiting it with patient endurance.
