Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken

Scripture Reading: Exodus 16: 2-8, 9-15

The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron as they wandered in the wilderness. ³The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots, cooking our meat, and we ate our fill of bread; for now you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill our whole assembly with hunger!"

⁴Then the LORD said to Moses, "I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. ⁵On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, there will be twice as much as they gather on other days."

⁶So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, "In the evening you shall know that it was the LORD who brought you out of the land of Egypt, ⁷and in the morning you shall see the glory of the LORD, because God has heard your complaining. For who are we, that you complain against *us*?"

⁸And Moses repeated, "Look, people, "God is going to give you meat to eat in the evening and your fill of bread in the morning, because the LORD has heard the complaining that you ut-

ter—what are we? Your complaining is not against us but against the LORD."

⁹Then Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, 'Draw near to the LORD, for God has heard your complaining.'" ¹⁰And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked toward the wilderness, and the glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud. ¹¹The LORD spoke to Moses and said, ¹²"I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the LORD your God.'"

¹³In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. ¹⁴When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. ¹⁵When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, "Mah nah?" which means, "What is it?" For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, "It is the bread that God has given you to eat.

Homework Help at St. Paul & St. Andrew

For many years St. Paul & St. Andrew has offered a tutoring program for K-12th grade students from 6-7pm on Wednesday evenings. We are about to start this year's program and anticipate an expanded set of students, many of whom are new arrivals and English language learners. We need to build our cohort of tutors to match this need. While Spanish-speakers are a plus, we could use all hands and hearts on deck.

If you are interested in being a weekly tutor, a substitute tutor, or learning more to see if it's a fit for you, come this Wednesday, 9/27, to orientation from 6-7pm at the church.

What we do: We tutor kids ages 5 - 17 years old, one-on-one

- That means we help kids with their homework, read with them, help with book reports, science projects, art projects, basically help them learn
- That means kids look forward to seeing us each week, telling us about their triumphs and their heartbreaks
- That means each kid has the undivided attention of their adult, who is focused entirely
 on their kid for a whole hour
- That means really good, powerful stuff happens for tutor and for the kid

We work with the parents of the kids being tutored

• That means offering a soft chair and snacks OR English conversation

Wednesdays 5:45 - 7:00 pm at St. Paul and St. Andrew

• We meet each Wednesday the kids are in school starting October 4th
