

³ Elijah was afraid and fled for his life; he took his servant and went to Beersheba in Judah. Leaving the servant there, ⁴ Elijah walked a whole day into the wilderness. He stopped and sat down in the shade of a tree and wished he would die. "It's too much, LORD," he prayed. "Take away my life; I might as well be dead!"

10 He answered, "LORD God Almighty, I have al-







Gospel Reading: Mark 9: 2-9; 14-29

²Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, ³ and his clothes became dazzling bright, such as no one on earth could brighten them. ⁴ And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. 5 Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here: let us set up three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." 6 He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. ⁷ Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice. "This is my Child, the Beloved: Illisten to him!" 8 Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.


⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen... ¹⁴ When they came to the other disciples. they saw a great crowd around them and some scribes arguing with them. 15 When the whole crowd saw Jesus, they were immediately overcome with awe, and they ran forward to greet him. 16 Jesus asked them, "What are you arguing about with them?" 17 Someone from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought you my son; he has a spirit that makes him unable to speak, ¹⁸ and whenever it seizes him, it dashes him down, and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid, and I asked your disciples to cast it out, but they could not do so." 19 He answered them, "You faithless generation, how

much longer must I be with you? How much longer must I put up with you? Bring him to me." ²⁰ And they brought the boy to him. When the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth.

²¹ Jesus asked the father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. 22 It has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you are able to do anything, help us! Have compassion on us!" 23 Jesus said to him, "If you are able! All things can be done for the one who believes." ²⁴ Immediately the father of the child cried out, a "I believe; help my unbelief!" 25 When Jesus saw that a crowd came running together. he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You spirit that keeps this boy from speaking and hearing, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again!" 26 After crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, "He is dead." 27 But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he was able to stand. 28 When Jesus had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" 29 He said to them, "This kind can come out only through prayer."


