

Call To Worship

One: To bear the blessing of God's grace, you must first take yourself to a place where everyone does not look like you or think like you,

Many: a place where they do not believe precisely as you believe, where their thoughts and ideas and gestures are not exact echoes of your own.

One: Here we gather. Many: We bring our sorrow. We bring our grief. We bring our fear. We bring our weariness, our pain,

One: our disgust at how broken the world is, how fractured how fragmented by its fighting, its wars, its hungers, its penchant for power, its ceaseless repetition of history it refuses to rise above.

Many: God's blessing of grace will not fix that. But in the place where we have gathered, we wait. Watch. Listen. One: We lay aside our inability to be surprised, our resistance to what we do not understand.

Many: We gather together to see whether this blessing turns to flame on our tongues,

One: sets us to speaking what we cannot fathom or opens our ears to a language beyond our imagining that comes as a knowing in our bones, a clarity in our hearts that tells us this is the reason we were made:

All: for this ache that finally opens us, for this struggle, this grace that scorches us toward one another and into the blazing day.

One: May we know this grace and welcome it in.


